A Message from the Director

Dear Supporters,

Larimer Humane Society recently released their annual report for their 2011 fiscal year (July 2010-June 2011) and it contained some great news. Their euthanasia rate for cats decreased almost 25 percent in comparison with their 2010 fiscal year – 281 fewer cats were euthanized!

There are a lot of different factors that I believe influenced these numbers. These factors include but are not limited to:

- ✓ The education of more community members and their belief that euthanasia is not and never has been an acceptable solution to pet overpopulation, therefore leading to their involvement in animal welfare through donations or volunteerism.

- ✓ The hard work of multiple community-based animal welfare groups over recent years to increase the number of community animals that are spayed and neutered.

- ✓ The collaboration of animal welfare groups with one another and with local businesses to save more pets' lives.

Although I am thrilled about the decrease, there are still far too many homeless animals being euthanized in our community. I hope that at some point during my life we will see a time when younger generations are shocked to hear that one of the common ways we dealt with homeless pets was by killing them.

Until then, Fort Collins Cat Rescue & Spay/Neuter Clinic will continue to treat not only the symptoms of pet overpopulation by sheltering as many homeless cats and kittens as we can until they find loving homes, but also treat the disease of pet overpopulation through our programs which spay and neuter animals and keep pets in their homes.

We are making a tremendous impact in the community, and by "we" I mean the staff, volunteers and supporters (YOU!) of this organization!

As the holidays and the end of the year approach, please remember this organization when it comes to your charitable giving.

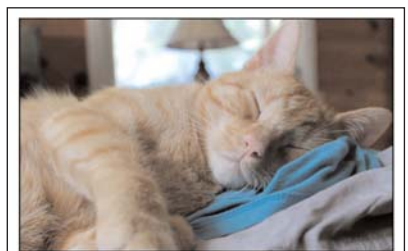

Human services programs grow rapidly

PAL+, Kibble Supply aim to keep pets in their homes by helping their guardians

Even in the best of economic times there will always be pet owners who cannot afford basic services for their dogs and cats. With the economy still in the slumps, more people than ever are having a hard time taking care of themselves, let alone being able to provide basic needs for their pets.

This creates a double whammy for Fort Collins Cat Rescue & Spay/Neuter Clinic. It becomes harder to secure donations while at the same time there's an increasing need to assist pet owners in providing safe, healthy environments for their pets.

"We need to not only provide a safe place for the animals that have become homeless, but also do all in our power to keep other animals from joining their ranks," Executive Director Sarah Swanty said.

We have been hard at work trying to make this a reality. This September we combined our PAL (Prevent a Litter) and PAVE (Providing Access to Vaccines for Everyone) services into a single program called PAL Plus (PAL+).

PAL+ provides spay/neuter surgeries and vaccines free of charge to low-income pet owners who must first qualify by filling out an application. Free microchipping was added to the program as well.

We kicked off PAL+ by setting up a booth at Poudre Valley Mobile Home Park on Sept. 15. Our executive director was joined by Outreach Coordinator Judy Miotke and bi-lingual volunteer

Lynn Hitchings that morning to help residents learn more about how they could get help with the basic needs for their pets. Having a volunteer who could speak Spanish came in handy as a number of pet owners did not speak English. *We are always in need of bi-lingual volunteers, especially at the clinic.*

Although the day got off to a slow start because people were hesitant to approach the table, by early afternoon curious residents made their way over, and the end of the day saw five animals scheduled for surgery with another six scheduled for vaccines and microchips.

There seems to be a never-ending need for these services. Applications for PAL+ have almost doubled from last year, and our funding barely keeps up in satisfying the demand of providing these services to prevent more homeless pets and disease.

This year, along with other donations, we have received a \$3,000 grant to fund PAL+ along with \$3,800 from a Poudre Pet & Feed Supply prize bicycle drawing.

Our goal for 2012 is to serve 500 pets at a cost of \$25,245.

Another human services program we are proud to offer is the

Kibble Supply Pet Food Pantry which helps pet owners experiencing financial hardship make sure their furry family members stay fed.

There are currently 157 people signed up for the cat food program, and we supplied almost 10,000 pounds of cat food in just the first 10 months of this year! We have 39 people signed up for the dog food program and have given away just over 1,600 pounds of dog food in 2011.

We had been relying primarily on pet food donations from local retailers to supply the program, but the demand outstripped our supply. More recently, the Rescue Bank National Pet Food Distribution Program has made it possible for us to keep the pantry better stocked. We are able to purchase entire pallets of dog and cat food from Rescue Bank for our Kibble Supply for only \$50 per pallet.

If you are looking for ways to give during the holidays, consider a contribution to our Kibble Supply or PAL+ programs and help both pets and their people alike. We are deeply appreciative of all the help we get and we couldn't do this without you!

30 new cages + dedicated volunteers = more space for kitties

Who's never dreamed about adding some extra square footage onto their homes? Well thanks to some generous grants and volunteer efforts at FCCRSNC our cats now have a little extra room to stretch their paws from now on!

After the state passed legislation in 2010 mandating larger enclosures for cats in shelters, we were hard at work writing grants to find funding to help pay for the new cages. The **PETCO Foundation** came through for us and gave us the largest grant we've had to date. The \$12,500 they donated along with \$500 from On Shore Foundation allowed us to buy 30 brand new enclosures for our cats.

Of course securing the donations and purchasing the cages was only part of the whole operation. We still had to assemble and install them. This is when our wonderful volunteers stepped up over Labor Day weekend to help assemble the enclosures. We had numerous volunteers help with this, but there were two whom we

want to shine a light on in this newsletter and acknowledge the hard work they put in for this project.

"We are especially grateful to **Jill Forest** and **Carol Landy**, who dedicated themselves to this project until every cage was assembled and in place," said Volunteer Coordinator Hilary Foshee. "Together, Jill and Carol worked over 50 hours on this project!"

Jill and Carol are longtime friends who started volunteering at the shelter back in August. When the e-mail went out asking for help setting up the cages, Jill and Carol jumped in with both feet and spent three days setting them up. Carol said the best part of the project was working with other volunteers. She said a lot of people helped and they couldn't have done it without the help of everyone involved.

Jill and Carol moved back to Colorado in February after being gone for 15 years. They have both done volunteer work before and are self-described animal lovers. Once they got everything unpacked and settled in they were able to start volunteering at FCCRSNC. Carol said the best part of volunteering is "a tossup between the people and animals we meet. Everyone is so wonderful there."

They were even able to provide a forever home for one of the shelter cats! They fell in love with "Shelby" after fostering her for a while and decided to adopt her.

Carol said it was a great feeling to see all the cages

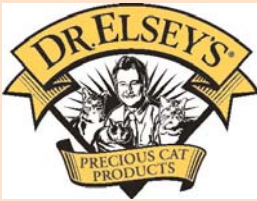
Susan Kusman volunteers anywhere from 20 to 30 hours a week on surgery days at our clinic, and more recently during Saturday vaccine clinics as well.

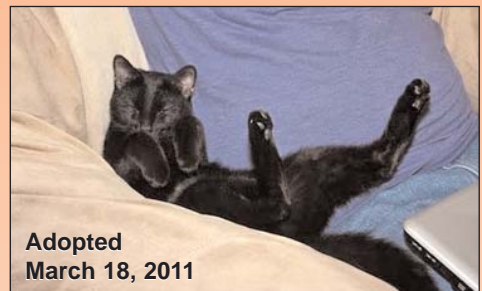

Jake has been staying busy

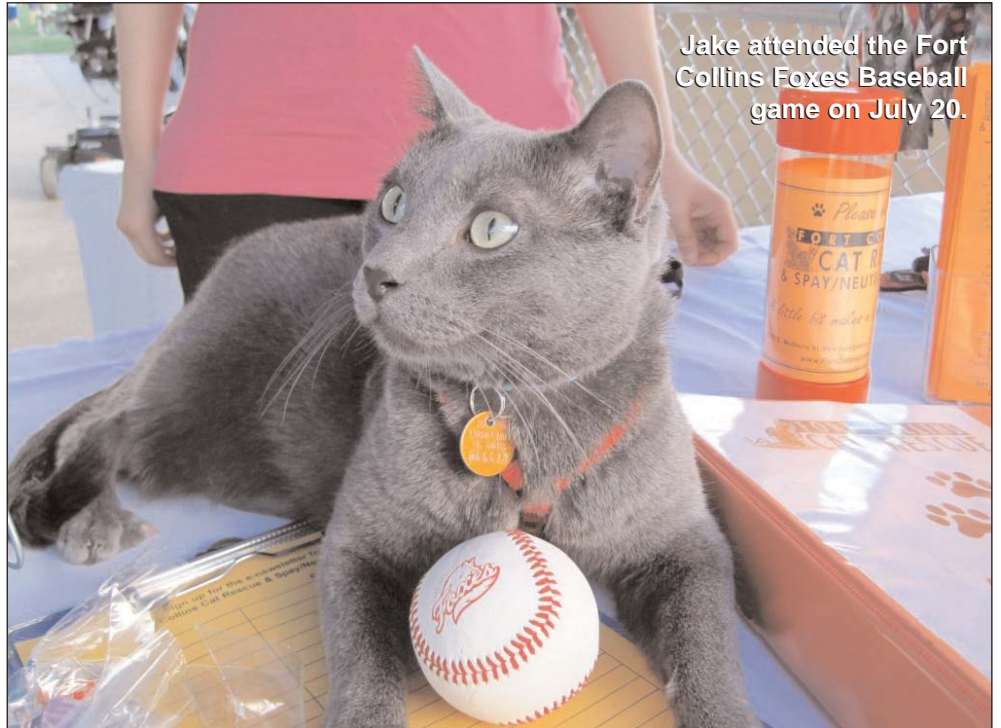
Our shelter's permanent resident and certified therapy cat, Jake, had a very eventful summer!
